# Curricular News

#### Science:

The Senior Infants and First Class were in for a treat on the morning of the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December, when Ms. Tangney brought her husband to school with her! Jer is a scientist and works in a lab. He brought the uniform he has to wear when he is doing experiments and the boys and girls got to try on his cool coat and goggles. He even left them with the class and they are already looking forward to dressing up and using them again! #### Literacy - M.S. Readathon:

This year 3rd class to 6th class took part in the M.S. Read-a-thon from the 9th of October to the 9th of November. Children were asked and encouraged to read as many books as they could and donate €1 per book they read. Many of the children worked so hard for the month, reading all sorts of books. We had many excellent readers who read over 15 books and other children improved immensely at their reading during this time. To celebrate this great reading the teachers from these classes chose their top two readers. The prize winners included:

- Ms. Hanley chose Phoebe Sheehy and Brett Shanahan from 6th class, who read a total of 25 books between them.
- Mrs. Murphy chose Tomás Houlihan, for the most expressive and improved reader and Jack Mullane, from 4th Class, who read 17 books.

These children received a prize of a book of puzzles and 'anti-boredom' activities from the school.

<u>Literacy:</u> <u>Spelling Workshop and Parents Talk with Mr. Brendan Culligan</u>

Brendan Culligan visited the school on Wednesday 18th November and completed two hours of continued professional development with teachers. He then provided a parent's information talk from 7-8p.m. Brendan is a lecturer and leading expert in the area of spelling development and is author of two books: 'Improving Children's Spelling' and 'Spelling & Handwriting: A Guide for Teachers and Parents'.

Brendan provided teachers and parents with plenty of advice on how to encourage and motivate pupils. The method being used by all teachers is:

LOOK - COVER - WRITE - CHECK

There are many ways that you can support your child with their spelling development. Please encourage your child to write down their spellings instead of calling the spelling out. Also encourage them to check the spelling themselves. Teachers have now changed how we correct spellings. If a pupil gets part of a spelling incorrect, this is marked for the pupil to check, rather than putting an X beside the whole word.

Brendan provided an information handout on spelling and handwriting and this was made available to all parents following the talk. A copy of this handout is also on our school website under the section: School Self Evaluation.

In January, staff will develop an action plan following on from Brendan's talk and this will be made available to all parents.



History: A Visit from the Army

We were really lucky this week to have been visited by two soldiers from the Irish Army!

On the 10th of November, Sergeant Derek Dinan and Private Ciara Quinn presented us with an Irish Flag and the 1916 Proclamation.

Sergeant Dinan told us all about the flag and what it is like to be in the army.

They asked us to raise our new Irish flag at 12 noon on Monday the 15th March. Every school in the country will join us!

We enjoyed asking them questions about their uniforms and singing and playing 'Amhrán na bhFiann' for them!



### Physical Education: Swimming

All children from  $4^{th}$  to  $6^{th}$  class will be beginning a six week block of swimming lessons in January in Askeaton Leisure Centre.
