


Artist in Residence



We recently applied for the Artist in Residence scheme funded by Limerick City and County Council. Last year, we had Artist in Residence Jeanne O'Connor who worked with 1st and 2nd class in the area of Creative Dance.

We have been successful again this year and our Artist in Residence is Katie O'Kelly who is a Ceramic Artist. She is going to work with pupils in 6th class after Easter and help them to plan, design and create ceramic Bird Houses which will link in with our 5th Green Flag on the theme of Biodiversity.



Robotics Challenge for 4th and 5th Class

In early February the pupils from 4th and 5th class in Mrs. Murphy's classroom spent a full day building robots and programming them under the expert guidance of Colmac Robotics. This project was sponsored by Analog Devices and only twenty schools in the county out of fifty were chosen to take part. The class was divided into seven teams.

Colman and Nicola arrived at the school with lots of gear and energy! The goal for the day was to build and programme a lego robot to perform a hillclimb up a ramp. Marks were awarded based on robot design, teamwork and succeeding at the hillclimb. The children thoroughly enjoyed the day and we very much appreciated the expert help and teaching from Colman and Nicola, of Colmac Robotics. At the end of the day the teams put their robots to the test. It was a tense and exciting finish. In the end the winning team was 'Cent Bot 2016' with the team Cian McGoey, Ellie Long, Nicole McNamara and Tomás Houlihan.

These children then went forward to the County Finals in Mungret College in February on the 20th. On this day the children will had to design and build another new robot to take on a new challenge. The new challenge was to face up to another robot and push it out of the ring. The battles were epic and as usual the children did us proud. 'CENT Bot 2016' made it successfully into the semi-finals but unfortunately reached the limit of its power at this point. The children were awarded bronze medals and lovely commemorative t-shirts on the day.



Grandparents Day 2016

As part of Catholic School Week 2016, we invited grandparents to our school to talk to their grandchild's class about what school was like for them growing up and other things. We were delighted with the response, with over forty grandparents showing up on the day! We took many photographs to remember the special day and can be all seen on the school website. The children thoroughly enjoyed the day and loved every minute of the time spent with the Grandparents.







Friendship Week 2016

We were very busy in school celebrating Friendship Week 2016. The following are some of the activities we did during the special week:

- A friendship quote was displayed on the new display monitor outside reception each day. The classes discussed each quote with their teacher.
- Each child got a template in the shape of a key. They had to write what they thought was the 'key to a good friendship'. The person who gave the best advice in each class won a prize!
- Mr. Keogh sold Friendship Bracelets for Amnesty International. We raised more than €440. Thank you and well done to all boys and girls!
- Each class got a template of a Friendship Tree. Every child printed their fingerprint on a branch of this tree. We now have a Friendship Forest with everybody's fingerprint!

- Two Friendship Sheriffs were on hand everyday; making sure everybody had someone to play with out in the yard!
- On Thursday, each child picked a name out of a hat randomly. They had to perform a Random Act of Kindness for that person during the day. We have heard fantastic accounts of children getting other children's coats for them, drawing pictures for them and paying them compliments! We're so lucky to have such kind boys and girls in our school.
- We also had a whole-school assembly on Friday where we announced the winners of the competition and sang two songs about friendship the third to sixth sang 'Lean on Me' by Bill Withers, while the juniors to second sang Bruno Mars' 'Count on Me'.

1916 Easter Rising Celebrations

On the 22nd February Alessio from Senior Infants brought in a newspaper supplement given to his family by his grandfather. The supplement was released with the Irish Independent on the Golden Jubilee of the Easter 1916 Rising. It was released in 1966, 50 years after the Insurrection. It contained some fantastic articles and pictures, which were passed on to the different classes for their perusal. It was a fantastic opportunity for the children to use this primary source for their history lessons. Thank you to Alessio and his family. Also, Alessio went on a road trip over the February mid-term, up to the GPO in Dublin. He informs us that bullet holes can still be seen and felt on the exterior walls of the post office.
