New Baby




- On Pancake Tuesday we were invited to a pancake party with 4th class where many of the children have older siblings.
- It was great fun and we ate some delicious American style pancakes with lots of toppings!






- *Buddy Reading with Third Class took place on a beautiful sunny afternoon on 31st of March.*





Senior Infants

These are stories that have been passed on for thousands of years!




3rd Class News

STEM


- 5th Class were busy designing wind powered cars and protective suits for eggs.




SET
