
Ideas and suggestions for fundraising and events were discussed at length and we are very excited with what we have planned.

School Self Evaluation

In 2011, the Department of Education published a document called 'Literacy and Numeracy for Learning and Life'. This was a national strategy to improve Literacy and Numeracy in all educational settings from 2011-2020.

As part of this national strategy, all schools have been asked to engage in a process of self-evaluation. This involves the staff, parents and pupils exploring and reflecting on what are the strengths of the school and what could be improved in relation to the teaching of Literacy and Numeracy. As a staff, we have been working on this process of 'Self Evaluation' to improve the teaching, learning and assessment in the school over the past number of years.



In the teaching of Maths, our focus has been on Problem Solving and word problems which is often a challenging part of the Maths curriculum for pupils. Teachers are using a variety of approaches to help pupils with word problems.

In the teaching of English, we are focusing on improving the teaching of Spellings and Phonics. Brendan Culligan, who is a leading lecturer and expert on the teaching of spellings will be visiting the school in November to provide teachers with advice and guidance on the best approaches when teaching spellings. We hope Brendan will be available to provide an information talk for parents also. More details of this will be provided after the mid-term break.

Literacy: Station Teaching

Station Teaching for Literacy is a project involving 3rd, 4th, and 5th classes for this past term. Our Learning Support teachers Mr. Keogh and Mrs. Cleary have been working with Ms. Fitzgerald and Mrs. Murphy. The novels they have been reading with the classes are: A Witch In A Fix, by Marian Broderick, Bill's New Frock and Diary of a Killer Cat, both by Anne Fine, Holes by Louis Sachar, The One and Only Ivan by Katherine Applegate, and The Year of Billy Miller by Kevin Henkes. Both students and teachers are enjoying reading these novels immensely.


The five stations include: **New Reading-** here the children read a chapter or more of their new novel with their class teacher. Next (after twenty minutes) the children will move onto the **Word Work/Comprehension** station- here the children will dissect what they have just read, focusing on different aspects of the English language that have come up- such as similes, metaphors, alliteration, analysing quotes, changing words into antonyms and synonyms, doing cloze activities based on reading etc.

The children then move onto the **Writing** Station. Here they focus on whatever writing genre that the school is doing at that present time. We are working on Recount Writing at the moment.

The fourth station is the **IPAD** station. The children will be working independently, using the IPADs to create an interactive book of activities based on their novel. Some of the things the children will be doing include: writing Character Profiles, summarising chapters, creating alternative titles, book covers.

The last station is the Workbook station, where the children will be working independently on a task that has been prepared by their class teacher.

It's a busy hour, which takes a lot of preplanning and preparation. Also the school has invested a large amount of money in purchasing all these wonderful novels. We did so in the knowledge that the children will benefit immensely from smaller group instruction, and a greater (three) teacher presence.



Halloween Celebrations

On Friday 23rd October, we have a Colours Day and boys and girls can wear their own clothes or dress up in their Halloween costume. Teachers will be getting into the Halloween spirit too and will be dressing up!! Each class is designing a pumpkin and we will have a special Whole School Assembly on Friday where all the boys and girls will come to the General Purpose Room and see who has the scariest and most creative pumpkin! 6th class will visit classrooms to do face painting. It promises to be a fun filled day! Thanks to the Parents Council for sponsoring pumpkins for each classroom and face paints as well a Halloween treat bag for all the boys and girls!
