#### Covid-19

The school has experienced many changes in recent times. We have all, pupils and staff alike, had to adapt to these new changes very quickly. Here are some of our changes:

- Children are new entering and exiting in their individual class fire exits from 8:40am each morning.
- Increased hand washing and sanitising has become part of the daily routine.
- Staff and any essential visitors to the school are asked to wear face masks, especially when working up close with our pupils.
- Children are seated in pods in their class bubbles. These pods remain for a block of weeks and teachers can move these pods only at extended school breaks e.g. The Mid-term break.
- The school has introduced staggered lunch breaks. We now have a Junior and Senior lunchtime. This
  is proving to be very successful, we have noticed less minor accidents on the yard and the children
  are enjoying the extra room to play.

To celebrate Happy Lámh day, Diarmuid taught us how to sing 'Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed' using Lámh. Lámh is a method of sign language used by people with intellectual disabilities as a way of communicating. Diarmuid did a fantastic job and our First class proved they are quick learners.





- We have been learning all about Irish Legends in Second Class. We read the story of The Brown Bull of Cooley which was about Queen Maeve and her husband Ailill who lived in Connacht. We watched a video clip of the Children of Lir and worked with our friends to discuss a new ending to that story.
- We particularly enjoyed the story of Finn Mac Cool and the Giants Causeway. Here are some pictures that we drew of Finn, the Irish giant and Angus, the Scottish giant. We also sequenced the story and did some lovely comic strips. Ask us to tell you about this story. We hope you enjoy our pictures.

On September 15th, 2nd Class enjoyed the rare sunshine and visited the beautiful local park and we even got to go into the playground too which was so much fun!

Over the past few weeks the boys and girls in Ms. Barry's second class have been learning all about Autumn. We discovered that certain animals such as bears, bats and hedgehogs all hibernate for the winter and have to gather and store food before they go to into hibernation. We also discovered that some birds migrate to warmer countries for the winter. We did a lot of work on researching swallows to discover why they migrate, the path they use when they migrate and where they go to when they leave Ireland. It was all super fun to learn about!


We then went on a nature walk to collect leaves and seeds. After our nature walk, we created wonderful artwork using the items which we collected. Here are some pictures:





- During Maths Week, Second Class completed lots work on 2D shapes! We learned all about the square, rectangle, triangle, circle, semicircle, hexagon, pentagon, and octagon. Did you know that a 2D shape is always, ALWAYS flat! We did so many fun activities that helped us to become shape superheros! We examined each shape and counted the number of sides and corners.
- We constructed squares, rectangles, triangles, circles and semicircles using
  geostrips and geoboards. We also folded the squares, rectangles, triangles,
  circles and semicircles in half and coloured them in! Do you know what shape
  a square becomes when folded and coloured in half? We even used picture
  boards to help us create lots of items all by using 2D shapes. Take a look at

• For Space week, the 3rd class pupils hosted 'Go Fly Your Kite' and Mary Immaculate College with a virtual workshop. We learnt all about the moon, space, rockets, the first landing on the moon and what it was like up on the moon. Later on that day, we all built our own kites that 'Go Fly Your Kite' had sent us. 

#### Teachers' Pet



#### 5th & 6th Class News

• In science we did an experiment to demonstrate the importance of hand washing. We tried different tests with individual slices of bread (wiping it on the floor, having everyone touch a slice without washing their hands, washing for only ten seconds, washing with only water and sanitising). We found that washing properly with soap and sanitising had the same result and after over a week those slices had very little mould, while the slice touched after washing hands for only ten seconds became very mouldy.

- 5th and 6<sup>th</sup> class also spent time learning about World War II. We read a book about a girl growing up in Germany during the war called Rose Blanche.
- We also looked at what life was like in Britain for people at the time, learning about rationing, evacuations from cities and how the government there encouraged people to support the war effort in different ways. People were asked to donate metal, grow their own vegetables, preserve food and be careful of what information they gave others. Hopefully 2021 will be their year!






### Staff Sports News

Keep away from bonfires. Bonfires often collapse or explode without warning causing serious injury.



Do not buy, use, or ignite fireworks.

Fireworks are illegal, dangerous and can cause serious injury.



If you dress up in dark clothes, add reflective material so you can be seen by motorists and cyclists.



Remember that your behaviour affects your neighbours. Loud noises created by fireworks, bangers and bonfires can scare people and animals.
